

One of the things that I really like about writing this newsletter and this column in particular is learning more about our members. This month we feature Dr. Mike Webb, that's right "Doctor". Mike made his presence at Abilene Clay Sports last November, making this his one year anniversary at the club. Here is a little history on Mike. Forty-eight year old Mike was born in Miami, where he eventually worked his way around the state as a professional trombone player, including an eight year period at Disney. Mike received his doctorate in music from Florida State University, at which time he performed as a trombone player in the Duke Ellington Orchestra, The Rosemary Clooney Band, and finally with another big band great Helen O'Connell. Touring the world began to take a toll on Mike so he entertained the idea of teaching music, but settled on doing expert musical instrument repair instead. That work took Mike to Tallahassee Florida, Montgomery, Alabama, Kansas City, Raleigh N.C., and finally to Abilene, where he and his wife Barb are managers of Caldwell Products. Son Richmond who is finishing high school in Florida also enjoys shooting, and may follow mom and dad to Abilene after graduation.

Mike's interest in shooting started while in high school, but he settled on "serious" shotgunning about ten years ago with an emphasis on trap, then skeet, and now sporting Mike's favorite shotgun sport is "all of them." clays. According to Mike, he participates heavily in whatever the club specializes in. "I just like to shoot, and if the club is a skeet club, that I shoot skeet, if it is sporting, then I shoot Upon accepting the position with Caldwell sportina." Products, he decided he had better find a club in Abilene, as well as some good barbeque restaurants. He located both six weeks before he moved. So what was Mike's first impression of ACS? Mike visited a few times, but his shotguns had not arrived as of yet, so he rode the course with Frank Sanchez and Steve Ellinger, who loaned Mike a gun and shells for a week or so. Mike says that "ACS is not the largest club he has been involved with, but may very well be the best." "There are good targets, good people, and a lot going on." In the year that Mike has been in Abilene, he has seen a lot of big improvements at the club. The sporting course and the clubhouse improvements have been great according to Mike, but would like to see the fivestand converted to Compak soon. That may be in the works. Mike likes to shoot his 425 Browning and Beretta 391 on Sporting, but is eagerly awaiting a new Perazzi MX-8 that should arrive by Christmas. That Perazzi will be his new Sporting Clays gun.

Mike would like to see ACS continue the great improvements, including upgrading the skeet houses, and possibly adding a "beginners course or field" for training new shooters. The non-profit fund raiser events are great. "ACS does those better than any club he has ever seen." Welcome Mike, we hope your first year in Abilene, and ACS have been all that you expected.
