

## March Member Profile, Mr. Don Wadsworth

Few people at Abilene Clay Sports can claim that they were there at the time and place of the beginning of sporting clays, but our ACS March member profile Mr. Don Wadsworth can. Born in 1934 in West Virginia, Don made his home in and around the area, graduating from West Virginia University in 1956. Ten days later, Don joined the U.S. Air Force and found himself in navigation school in Harlingen, Texas. After learning how to navigate, he was stationed in Bermuda as a hurricane hunter. "It's true that the eye of the storm is calm, in fact, that's where we always ate our lunch!" 1960 saw Don moving to Langley AFB, back in Virginia assigned to tanker flights. In 1963 Don was again reassigned, this time to C-130's. Two years later, Don found himself active in the Vietnam War, stationed in the Philippines, living out of tents

Dyess AFB here in Abilene became Don's home in 1966, and saw the beginning of his involvement with our club. You may recall from the history of our organization that the move to Lake Kirby was in 1967. In 1972 Don was assigned to England for a four year time period. While in England, Don began participating with his Winchester 101 in a new sport called "sporting clays" that had just been developed at some of the English shooting clubs. "They had traps in trees and anywhere else that could stick one." The sport would not make the move to the U.S. for some time. In 1976, Don returned to Abilene, retired from the air force in 1977, and has remained here since. Never one to sit around doing

nothing, Don took on other tasks including a paper route, driving 120 miles each night, dispatching for Pride refining at the Abilene airport, and then for Dillard's Department Store where he stayed for 16 years.

So what has been the biggest change the club has gone through since 1967? Well, according to Don, the addition of the sporting clays program that he saw born in England has been the single largest improvement that the club has made. Indeed, Don was one of the original members, along with Dean Oehlke, Steve Ellinger, Bill Baxter and a few of our friends from San Angelo who designed and constructed our sporting course. "Skeet and trap has gone by the wayside, with sporting the way to go." Don enjoys sporting the most of all clay target shooting sports. "It's something different every time." Don enjoys his 30" Browning 435 the most, and feels

that he shoots it the best.. He shoots factory loads during tournaments, and reloads for practice. The long crosser gives Don the biggest challenge, and lately the big tower has been giving Don a few headaches.

Don has been very active in keeping our facility in tip-top shape for many years. During the summer months, there is hardly a day that Don is not operating our mower keeping the club looking good for our members and guests. Assisting our general manager Don Dunn on keeping the grounds in good shape has been something that Don enjoys, and we hope that he will continue to offer such dedication. Don would like to see the club find a way to install another sporting clays course in the future, perhaps east of the skeet fields. "The club is as much fun as it was in the late 1960's, but a much better place." We agree, and in many ways, due to Don's involvement. We also want to thank Don's wonderful wife Nancy who graces us with her presence several times during the year, for allowing us to steal Don's time. Don and Nancy have three kids, Tom, Judy, and Amy, all grown of course, and a herd of grandkids. Thanks Don for all of your hard work. We may just name the mower after you!
